Extrasorb Under-Pad		
Classification	Continence Containment: Linen Protector Under-Pad	
Key Points	 A disposable under-pad designed with a breathable top (inside) sheet, a super absorbent polymer (SAP) odour management middle layer and an air-permeable back (outside) sheet. In the presence of moisture, the top sheet is designed to keep the skin that is in contact with the under-pad dry. The under-pads can hold up to 1000mL moisture. When wet, the under-pad is air-permeable until it reaches its saturation point. May be used on a support surface that has microclimate features e.g., low air-loss mattress. 	
Indications	 To be used in conjunction with skin protectants as per the British Columbia Adult Skin Care Protocol: For the client who is not wearing a pad-insert/ knit pant system or continence brief and has repeated exposure to urinary and/or fecal incontinence. For the client who is undergoing toilet retraining and is at risk for an incontinent episode. When exposing the client's perineal area 'to air' as a treatment for Incontinence Associated Dermatitis. For the client who has exposure to moderate amounts moisture; e.g., perspiration, weepy skin. If amounts are heavy use the Ultrasorb Under-Pad. 	
Precautions	Ensure that the print side of the under-pad is down on the bed surface (white side up).	
Contraindications	 Do not fold or tuck under-pad into the perineal area; it must lie flat in order to 'gel' the fluid. Do not use for procedures; use a disposable procedure (blue) pad. Do not layer under-pads on top of each other. Do not use under-pad as a lifting sheet.

	Application Directions	Rationale
Ensure the mattress bed sheet is without wrinkles.		
Lay the under-pad flat on the surface with the print side down and white side up. Do not double layer the under-pads.		Minimal layers will assist with pressure injury prevention.
Change Frequency	·	
Change when soiled or when the under-pad begins to reach its saturation point, the gel of the core swells which is noticeable both visually and to the touch.		Should the under-pad reach its saturation point, it can no longer pull the urine into its core and the client's skin then is in contact with the urine/fluid. This contact leads to an increase risk for Incontinence Associated
Product is disposable; do not launder.		Dermatitis (IAD) and sacral-coccyx Pressure Injury.
Expected Outcome Under-pad will protect the linen from incontinence episodes.
