Contraindications	Do not use for wounds with an untreated clinical infection	
	Do not use on fragile peri-wound skin	
	Do not use on wounds with deep tissue damage	
	Do not use on wound with undermining or tunnels/ sinus tracts

To Remove		
Hold the dressing in place with one hand. Use the other hand to		This will reduce skin stripping or tearing.

Frequency of Dressing Change		
Will depend upon the amount of exudates. Change dressing		
once every 5-7 days.		
Expected Outcome		
Exudate is managed with no peri-wound maceration.
