<b>ReadyBath Cap</b>	
<b>Classification</b>	<b>Cleanser: Shampoo</b>
<b>Key Points</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conditioning shampoo cap.</li> <li>• Rinse-free.</li> <li>• pH balanced.</li> <li>• Hypoallergenic.</li> <li>• Fragrance free.</li> </ul>
<b>Indications</b>	• Patients/clients/residents needing their hair washed but who are unable to use shower or tub.
<b>Precautions</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• External use only.</li> <li>• Single use only, do not reuse.</li> <li>• Do not flush cap or put in macerator. Dispose in garbage.</li> </ul>
<b>Contraindications</b>	• Do not use with known allergy or sensitivity to any of the product ingredients.
<b>Formats &amp; Sizes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• 1 cap per package</li> </ul> <div style="text-align: right;">  </div>
Application Directions	Rationale
Each package is single patient use.	To minimize risk of cross-contamination.
<b>To Apply</b>	
Use a washcloth moistened with warm water to remove excessive amounts of blood, gels or dirt from hair prior to using the cap.	Product will not remove excessive amounts of blood, gels or dirt.
Use at room temperature or warm the cap.	Warm shampoo cap provides increased client comfort.
<p><b>Warming in microwave</b> is not recommended, only use microwave for warming if facility/unit policy allows. Peel open label and warm for no longer than 15 seconds.</p> <p><b>Sage warmer's</b> display system switch, on back of the warmer, should be set to "C" only if CHG Antiseptic Body Cleanser wipes are in warmer. If no CHG Antiseptic Body Cleanser wipes in warmer, set display system switch to "B". The coloured lights indicate the heating status of the package adjacent to the light:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Yellow light – package has not reached the target temperature.</li> <li>• Steady green light – package has reached target temperature.</li> <li>• Flashing green light – package has been at target temperature for 48 hours and should be used first.</li> <li>• Red light (only visible if display system switch is set to "C") – package has been at target temperature for over 84 hours and CHG Antiseptic Body Cleanser wipes should be discarded and other wipes or shampoo caps should be used first.</li> </ul> <p>Once package has been removed from warmer and taken to client's bedside, do not put back in warmer for re-warming.</p> <p>Closely monitor heat level, especially for infants or unresponsive or skin-sensitive individuals. Do not use if excessively hot.</p>	<p>Inconsistent heating can occur. Microwave wattage varies. Adjust heating time accordingly.</p> <p>All basinless wipes and shampoo caps can be in warmer with display system switch set to "C" as this does not impact temperature.</p> <p>Packages take a approximately 2 hours to warm.</p> <div style="text-align: center;">  </div> <p>All wipes and shampoo caps except Antiseptic Body Cleanser Cloths are safe to use after 84 hours at target temperature.</p> <p>To reduce the risk of cross-contamination between clients.</p> <p>Use caution when determining heat level as gloves diminish sensitivity to heat.</p>
Tear open package and remove cap.	
Place cap on client's head, making sure the whole scalp is covered and all the hair is tucked in.	



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<p>Massage hair through cap until hair feels saturated. This takes approximately 1-2 minutes for short hair and 2-3 minutes for longer hair.</p> <p>Remove cap, do not rinse. Towel dry and then comb out hair.</p>	<p>Cap contains shampoo and conditioner so no need to add soap or water.</p>
<p><b>Disposal</b></p>	
<p>Discard into the garbage after use. Do not flush cap or put in macerator.</p>	<p>Caps may plug/clog plumbing.</p>
<p><b>Expected Outcome</b></p>	
<p>Clean and conditioned hair.</p> <p>Product performs as expected.</p>	<p>If product does not perform as expected, notify NSWOC/Wound Clinician and consider submitting a Product Concern form.</p>
